4th ISTIC Biennial Conference on Women in Science, Technology and Innovation: Empowering Women through Technology 22 – 23 July 2019, Kuala Lumpur

INTRODUCTION

Advances in technology has brought a lot of benefits to people in many aspects. Technology can help ease the work otherwise performed by hands, treat more sick people, saves more lives and enhance the well - being of mankind. It connects people, it saves time, improves communication, increases productivity and it has become an essential part of peoples' lives. The benefits are obvious and everyone should have the means to benefit from it. Digital and mobile technologies for example and the Internet have opened a lot of opportunities for women to move ahead - providing women with opportunities to find and share information, access educational and health services, generate income, interact, collaborate, network, have their voices heard. Connecting women through the use of technology can yield incredible returns in social and economic development. Remote work platforms will allow women to work from anywhere in the world and for anyone in the world. Access to technology therefore plays an important role in reinforcing gender inequality, especially in developing countries.

This supports the UN SDG (2016-2030) Goal 5 which aims at the empowerment of women and girls and specifically Goal 5. B which concerns enhancing the use of enabling technology, in particular information and communications technology, to promote the empowerment of women.

Much has been achieved in this aspect. For example in many countries the proportion of women having mobile telephones does not lag far behind the men. In Malaysia, the percentage of women with mobile telephones is very close behind the men which is 92.5% compared to men at 96.4%. In Bahrain the proportion is 100% for both men and women. However, there are countries where the figures are less encouraging. In Indonesia, the figure for males is 63.4% compared to 50.4% for females while in Iran, the figure stands at 76% for males and 63.2% for females. A lack of access to technology prevents many women from fully benefiting from the use of digital technology, mobile technologies and the internet. Inadequate infrastructure and the high cost of connectivity are part of the problem.

This 4th International Conference will devolve from the resolutions of the 3th Biennial International Conference held in Kuala Lumpur in 2017. Two of the resolutions refer particularly to technology in relation to gender digital divide, and internet trading and borrowing towards empowering women. It will give focus on how technology helps to uplift women in their lives thus contributing to the achievement of the overall UN Sustainable Goals 2016-2030. The Conference also has the strong support of UNESCO, UN WOMEN, UN Office for South-South Cooperation and the Government of Malaysia.

The Malaysian Deputy Prime Minister cum Minister of Women, Family and Community Development (KPWKM), The Most Honourable, Dato' Seri Dr. Wan Azizah Wan Ismail has been invited to open the Conference together with UNESCO Director-General, Her Excellency Audrey Azoulay. The Malaysian Minister of Energy, Science Technology, Environment and Climate Change (MESTECC). The Honourable Yeo Bee Yin has been invited to close the Conference. The Executive Director of UN Women, Her Excellency Phumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka has accepted ISTIC invitation to deliver a keynote address; so has the former President of the Republic of Mauritius/ L'Oréal-UNESCO for Women in Science Laureate, Her Excellency Dr. Ameenah Gurib-Fakim. Another invited Keynote speaker is the President of the Royal Scientific Society of Jordan, HRH Princess Sumaya bint El Hassan.

The International Science, Technology and Innovation Centre (ISTIC) for South-South Cooperation under the auspices of UNESCO was established on 21 January 2008 and is based in Kuala Lumpur. The creation of the ISTIC is a follow up of the Doha Plan of Action which has been adopted by the Heads of States and Government of the Group of 77 and China, during the meeting in Doha, Qatar, from 12 to 16 June 2005 on the occasion of the Second South-South Summit of the Group of 77 (G77). ISTIC is fully funded by the Government of Malaysia. One of the main functions of ISTIC is to develop and implement science, technology and innovation development programme for members of G77 and China targeted at facilitating the integration of national science, technology and innovation policies, capacity building, exchange of experiences and best practices, and creating a problem-solving network of centres of excellence in developing countries.
